ERIC CRISS | WIND ENSEMBLE DIRECTOR

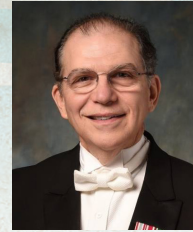


Originally from West Salem, Ohio, Eric came to Grace College in 1995 to pursue a music degree. During his time at Grace, Eric performed in Grace Brass under Tim Zimmerman and Grace Community Orchestra under Ardis Faber. While attending Grace, he met his wife, Rochelle Criss. While Eric and Rochelle were starting their family, Eric also performed at Wagon Wheel Theatre for 7 years and completed his Master's degree at Ball State University in 2011.

Eric's teaching career has included directing band at Columbia City High School from 2003-2008 and NorthWood High School for 11 years and counting! His ensembles have consistently received gold ratings and marching band has enjoyed 8 state finals appearances. In December 2017 Eric was inducted into Phi Beta Mu by his mentor and friend, Mr. Martin Becker.

Eric, Rochelle and their three children, Graham, Grant and Ainsley reside in Warsaw and attend Winona Lake Grace Brethren Church.

DR. JOHN R. PASTIN | LT CMDR, USN (RET.)



John Pastin retired in May 2017 as the Dean of the College of Performing Arts, at Rowan University, Glassboro, New Jersey, where he led the departments of Music, Theatre, Dance and Art. In September 1998, following a distinguished 30-year career as a U.S. Navy Bandmaster he became the Director of Bands, at Rowan, where he conducted the Wind Ensemble and Concert Band, and taught all levels of conducting. He is recognized nationally as a conductor of bands, clinician and adjudicator. Pastin also remains active as a composer, arranger and commercial jazz woodwind performer.

As a thirty-year veteran of the Navy's Music Program, Pastin conducted and commanded some of the Navy's most prestigious bands, including: the US Navy Show Band, Navy Bands at Pearl Harbor, Seattle, Naples, Italy, the U.S. Naval Academy, New Orleans, Orlando, and he retired in 1998 as the Officer in Charge/Leader of the presidential unit United States Navy Band, Washington, DC.

His performances include special concerts and ceremonies at the White House, Carnegie Hall, Kennedy Center, Constitution Hall, the Vatican, Saint Petersburg Russia, Tokyo Japan, Beijing China, performance tours throughout Europe and to all fifty states.

Pastin holds Doctor of Musical Arts and Master of Music degrees in conducting, as well as a Bachelors degree in jazz performance.

Judie Meulink received a Bachelor of Music Education degree from Calvin College in Grand Rapids, Michigan; a Master of Music Education degree with an emphasis in Instrumental Conducting from the Hartt School of Music in West Hartford, Connecticut; and a Doctor of Arts degree in Music Education from Ball State University, in Muncie, Indiana. In the undergraduate and Master's programs, her major instrument was the clarinet. For the doctoral degree, Dr. Meulink focused on piano study, earning a minor in Piano Accompanying/Chamber Music.

After completing her undergraduate studies, Dr. Meulink taught band, choir and general music at the high school and elementary level. She has operated a private teaching studio and has been an accompanist for many years.
